IS THE HANDWRITING ON THE WALL?

Since everything written in the Bible is for our instruction, Daniel 5 is more than simply the biblical record of the collapse of the Babylonian Empire on October 12, 539 B.C. What led to the demise of this world power? How do you know when "the handwriting is on the wall"?

The handwriting is on the wall when:

- 1. A nation is lulled to sleep by **complacency** (5:1, 29-31)
- 2. A nation openly treats God with contempt (5:1-4,22-23)
- 3. A nation responds to crisis with **panic** rather than **repentance** (5:5-10, 29-31)
- 4. A nation carelessly forgets **its heritage** (5:11-22)
- 5. A nation is callous to the goodness of God (5:23)

KEEPING IT REAL

Scripture holds Daniel and Joseph in high regard in terms of leading faithfully despite serving under pagan kings. How would Daniel or Joseph engage in our public square today?

O LOOK AT THE BOOK

John 8 describes the scribes and Pharisees trying to trap Jesus. Jesus, with the hand of God, twice stooped down and wrote on the ground. What do you think He wrote?

Daniel apparently had been serving in obscurity for 20+ years (after serving prominently under Nebuchadnezzar) before being summoned by Belshazzar. Discuss Daniel's humility and how the Lord elevated him under both Nebuchadnezzar and Belshazzar.

What situation are you currently facing where you need to trust that God is in control rather than trusting in your own wisdom or power? What do you need to do?
