Wrappin' It Up: 2020 in Review Jude part 1

Questions to help us refocus for the year ahead:
1. Did I forget who I am? (Jude 1-2)
2. Did I fight for that which is most important? (Jude 3)
3. Did I recognize the dangers along the way? (Jude 4-13)

4. Did I live my days with the end in mind? (Jude 14-16)

- O Memorize Jude 3.
- O Take some time to look back at 2020.

- O Bring in Advent Conspiracy supplies for Family Promise.

DISCOVERY QUESTIONSFOR FAMILY OR GROUP DISCUSSION

Check-In: Since we last met, how did your "I will..." and sharing go?

- 1. What are you thankful for? What challenge or stress are you facing? Do you know anyone who needs help at this time? As a group, how can we help?
- 2. Read **GENESIS 4:3–16** together (at least twice), and take turns retelling it in your own words as if sharing with a friend who isn't here.
- 3. What stands out to you and why? What do these verses tell us about God? What do these verses tell us about humanity/about us?
- If this is God speaking, how will you apply it to your life? (Share a specific: "I will...")
- 5. Who will you share with before we meet again? (Name a specific person you plan to **share with.**)
