KEEPING IT REAL

1 Describe worry in terms of practical examples in your life.

LOOK AT THE BOOK

- 2 Deuteronomy 28 spells out both the blessings of following the Lord faithfully and the consequences of rebelling against Him. Moses told the people either blessings (28:2) or curses (28:15) will "come upon you and overtake you." Discuss the "overtake you" part in terms of the assurance that comes with being faithful.
- 3 In Matthew 13:44-46, Jesus compares the kingdom to a great treasure. Discuss the desirability of kingdom based on what the "men" in these parables were willing to do to obtain it.
